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## Section 12: Ecological Information

Ecological classifications are based on the IMDG/GHS criteria in conjunction with ecotoxicological data from our suppliers, the European Chemical Agency database (<u>http://echa.europa.eu</u>), and other reliable sources.

Contains silver particles less than a 1 mm in size but >100 nm (larger than nanoparticles), which are very toxic to the environment in their ionic form. While both are insoluble in water, classification is being harmonized to EU classification. The classification that follows takes into account to chronic aqueous toxicity of category 1 (M = 10) of the EU.

In Europe, similar epoxy resin mixtures with CAS# 28064-14-4 are generally classified as chronic category 2 marine pollutant due to LC50 96 h of >1 mg/L but  $\leq$ 10 mg/L.

The alkyl glycidyl ether and phenol, polymer with formaldehyde are not classifiable as ecotoxic hazards under GHS criteria.
