





Fig. 3. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values





Fig. 4. DC current gain as a function of collector current; typical values





Fig. 5. Collector current as a function of collector-emitter voltage; typical values





Fig. 6. Base-emitter voltage as a function of collector current; typical values





Fig. 7. Base-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values





**Fig. 8. Collector-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values**








Fig. 12. Test circuit for switching times




Fig. 13. Package outline SOT89




Fig. 14. Reflow soldering footprint for SOT89




Fig. 15. Wave soldering footprint for SOT89
